

**DANGEROUS DRUGS**

REGULATIONS DATED 28TH MARCH, 1957, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION NINE OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1951.

In pursuance of Section nine of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1951, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. At the end of Regulation 13 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations, 1938, there shall be added the following paragraph, that is to say:—

(6) Members of the Royal Ulster Constabulary who are in charge of Police Stations, and such other members of that Force as the Inspector General may approve for the purpose, are hereby authorised to be in possession of morphine in ampoule form for administration in cases of emergency.

Morphine in the possession of each member of the Force so authorised shall, except when required for mobile units of the Force, be kept by him in a locked receptacle.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957.

ORDER, DATED 22ND JANUARY, 1957, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER SECTION 109(3) OF THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 2 OF THE EDUCATION (AMENDMENT) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1953.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by sub-section (3) of Section 109 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, as amended by Section 2 of the Education (Amendment) Act (Northern Ireland), 1953, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The Compulsory School Age (Postponement) Order (Northern Ireland), 1953, shall cease to have effect on 31st March, 1957.
2. This Order may be cited as the Compulsory School Age Order (Northern Ireland), 1957.
