

REGULATIONS, DATED 28TH JUNE, 1957, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1956, AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Special Schools (Salaries and Allowances of Teachers) (Amending) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957, and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

(2) In these Regulations the expression “the principal Regulations” means the Special Schools (Salaries and Allowances of Teachers) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957(a).

(3) These Regulations amend and shall be construed as one with the principal Regulations.

2. In Regulation 10 of the principal Regulations for the date “31st July, 1957” there shall be substituted the date “31st October, 1957”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations postpone the date of election for the acceptance of the provisions of the Regulations arising out of the Reports of the Committee appointed by the Minister of Education to consider the salaries, allowances and other matters affecting the remuneration of teachers.

State Exhibitions

REGULATIONS, DATED 7TH MAY, 1957, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1956, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as “the Ministry”) in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Section 77

of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the State Exhibitions Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st August, 1957.

2. The Ministry may award annually a number of Exhibitions tenable at Universities, to be known as State Exhibitions.

3. The number of Exhibitions to be awarded each year shall be determined by the Ministry.

4.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Regulation, Exhibitions, to be known as Group I Exhibitions, shall be awarded in order of merit on the results of the relevant examination in the group of subjects set out in Part I of the Schedule.

(2) Subject to the provisions of this Regulation, Exhibitions, to be known as Group II Exhibitions, shall be awarded in order of merit on the results of the relevant examination in the group of subjects set out in Part II of the Schedule.

(3) An applicant may not obtain both a Group I Exhibition and a Group II Exhibition.

(4) A person who obtains an Exhibition may not at any time obtain another Exhibition.

(5) The Ministry may draw up separate orders of merit for boys and girls.

(6) In this Regulation the expression "relevant examination" means the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination held in the year in which application is made for an Exhibition.

5. To be eligible for the award of an Exhibition under Regulation 4 an applicant must have obtained passes in such subjects of the Ministry's Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination as are necessary for a candidate to qualify for the award of the Certificate.

6. In addition to the awards made under Regulation 4 the Ministry may in 1957 and 1958 award to applicants in attendance at schools outside Northern Ireland a number of Exhibitions on the results of the examinations held in the year of application for the General Certificate of Education of examining bodies in England and Wales or for the Scottish Leaving Certificate of the Scottish Education Department, if in the opinion of the Ministry the applicants have reached a standard of merit at least equivalent to that reached by successful candidates for awards under Regulation 4.

7. To be eligible for the award of an Exhibition, an applicant must—

(a) be ordinarily resident in Northern Ireland; and

(b) be under 19 years of age on the first day of July in the year in which the award is made.

8.—(1) An Exhibition shall be tenable at a university and in respect of a course of study leading to a degree approved by the Ministry, and shall, subject to the satisfactory conduct and progress of the holder, be continued for such time, not exceeding four years, as may be necessary to enable the holder to obtain the degree:

Provided that if the holder obtains the degree in three years the Ministry may renew his Exhibition for a fourth year to enable him to pursue a further university course of study approved by the Ministry which is not a course in respect of which a grant may be made under the Postgraduate Studentships Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1957.

(2) An applicant to whom an Exhibition has been awarded shall enter upon the approved course of study in the year in which the award is made or, if the Ministry so approves, in a later year.

9. An Exhibition shall be of the value of £80 per annum, and shall, subject to Regulation 8(1), be paid in such a manner as the Ministry may determine:

Provided, however, that if the holder of an Exhibition is for any reason absent from his course of study or fails to comply with the directions of the Ministry or the University Authorities, the Ministry may reduce or withhold any payment normally due in respect of the Exhibition.

10. An application for the Exhibition must be made in such manner and by such date as the Ministry may determine.

11. The State Exhibitions Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1953(a), shall be revoked as from 31st July, 1957:

Provided that any Exhibition awarded under those Regulations may be continued as though it had been awarded under these Regulations.

SCHEDULE
(Regulation 4)

PART I

The order of merit for Group I Exhibitions shall be determined by the addition of the marks obtained in *three* subjects of the examination at advanced level, including at least *two* of the following subjects: English Literature, Ancient History, Modern History, languages other than English.

PART II

The order of merit for Group II Exhibitions shall be determined by the addition of the marks obtained in *three* subjects of the examination at advanced level, including at least *two* of the following subjects: Mathematics: General Course, Pure Mathematics, Applied Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Botany or Biology, Geography, Geometrical Drawing.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations, which follow upon the revision with effect from 1957 of the Rules and Programme for the Grammar School Senior Certificate Examination, raise the upper age limit for applicants for State Exhibitions from "under 18 years of age on the first day of March" to "under 19 years of age on the first day of July" in the year in which the award is made, and reduce from four to three the number of subjects in a group of subjects to be counted for the purpose of an award. They also provide for the renewal of an Exhibition for a fourth year where the holder completes his approved course in three years.
