The Ministry of Agriculture by virtue of and in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sub-section 2 of Section 10 of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Scheme:—

Citation, Commencement and Construction

1. This Scheme, which may be cited as the Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) (Amendment No. 4) Scheme, 1958, shall come into operation on the twenty-fifth day of August, 1958, and shall be read as one with the Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) Scheme, 1954(b), (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Scheme"), as amended by the Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) (Amendment) Scheme, 1955(c), the Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) (Amendment No. 2) Scheme, 1957(d) and the Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) (Amendment No. 3) Scheme, 1958(e).

Amendment of the principal Scheme

- 2. The principal Scheme shall be amended as follows:—
- (1) In Article 6 the following new sub-article shall be added after the end of the present Article:—
 - "(g) Where the test referred to in sub-article (1) of Article 5 and the first assisted test reveal no reactors in the herd, the Ministry may waive the second assisted test required by sub-article (d) hereof, in which case the herd will become eligible for official test after the first assisted test."
- (2) In Article 14 the following words shall be added after the end of sub-article (1):

"Provided that a person who habitually engages in the trade or business of buying and selling cattle may receive bonus only in accordance with the terms of Article 15."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Scheme but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This amendment makes two minor changes in the Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) Scheme, 1954. The first reduces by one the number of tests which a clean herd must pass before becoming attested. The second is a restriction necessary to ensure that bonus payments are not made in respect of animals not genuinely part of an attested herd.

The Minister of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sub-section (2) of section nine of, and section ten of the Agriculture (Poisonous Substances) Act (Northern Ireland), 1954(a) and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, and after consultation with such organisations as appear to him to represent the interests concerned, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Short title and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Agriculture (Poisonous Substances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1958, shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and fifty-eight.

Revocation and savings

- 2.—(1) The Agriculture (Poisonous Substances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1955(b), are hereby revoked.
- (2) Nothing in these regulations shall affect any approval or notice given, register kept, certificate granted, or any other thing done under the Agriculture (Poisonous Substances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1955, but any such approval, notice, register, certificate, or thing done shall if in force on the coming into operation of these regulations, continue in force as if it had
