EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which has effect on and from 28th July, 1958, amends the Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order, 1956 (Order N.I.H.M. (24)), as amended by the Hat, Cap and Millinery Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1957 (Order N.I.H.M. (28)), by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders. Order N.I.H.M. (28) is revoked.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.

The Laundry Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1958

1958. No. 172

Whereas the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance (hereinafter in this Order referred to as "the Ministry") has received from the Laundry Wages Council (Northern Ireland) the wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto;

Now, therefore, the Ministry by virtue of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule hereto shall have effect on and from the specified date and as from the date immediately preceding the specified date the Laundry Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1957(b), shall cease to have effect.

2. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 6th day of November, 1958, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

3. This Order may be cited as the Laundry Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1958.
