REGULATIONS DATED 13TH FEBRUARY, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS WITH THE CONCURRENCE OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER SECTIONS NINETEEN, THIRTY-NINE AND FIFTY-FOUR OF THE ELECTIONS AND FRANCHISE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1946.

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Sections Nineteen, Thirty-Nine and Fifty-Four of the Elections and Franchise Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, and of every other power it thereunto enabling and with the concurrence of the Ministry of Finance hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electoral (Registration Expenses) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1958.

2. The scales of remuneration of officers and expenses set out in the Schedule shall apply to the Register of Electors to be published under Section Thirteen of the Elections and Franchise Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, in the year 1958.

3. The Electoral (Registration Expenses) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1952, and the Electoral (Registration Expenses) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1954, are hereby revoked.

4. The provisions as to remuneration and expenses in Regulation 1 of the Electoral (Assistant Revising Officers) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1946, shall cease to have effect.
