Grants in respect of farmhouses and of approved workers' houses

ORDER*, DATED 17TH NOVEMBER, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER SECTION 12 OF THE HOUSING ON FARMS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1950.

The Ministry of Health and Local Government (in this Order referred to as "the Ministry"), with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on the Ministry by section twelve of the Housing on Farms Act (Northern Ireland), 1950 (in this Order referred to as "the Act") and of every other power it thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The Housing on Farms Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, shall have effect as if for the words "first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine" in sub-section (2) of sections one, four and seven, respectively, there were substituted the words "first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty".

Grants for provision of new farmhouses

2. The amount of grant payable under section one of the Act in respect of a new farmhouse completed before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-one in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by the Ministry before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty, and so certified by an officer of the Ministry and falling within any one of the categories mentioned in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order shall be the amount specified opposite such category in the second column of the said Schedule.

Grants for provision of houses for approved workers

3. The amount of grant payable under section four of the Act in respect of an approved worker's house completed before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-one in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by the Ministry before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty, and so certified by an officer of the Ministry and falling within any one of the categories mentioned in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order shall be the amount specified opposite such category in the second column of the said Schedule.

Grants for reconditioning premises as farmhouses and approved worker's houses

⁴, **4**. The amount of grant payable under section seven of the Act in respect of the reconditioning of any premises for use as a farmhouse or approved worker's house completed before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by the Ministry before the fourth day of February, nineteen hundred and fifty-five, and so certified by an officer of the Ministry and falling within any one of the categories mentioned in the first column of the Third Schedule to this Order shall be the amount specified opposite such category in the second column of the said Schedule.

5. The amount of grant payable under section seven of the Act in respect of the reconditioning of any premises for use as a farmhouse or approved worker's house completed before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-one in accordance with plans submitted to and approved by the Ministry on or after the fourth day of February, nineteen hundred and fifty-five and before the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty, and so certified by an officer of the Ministry and falling within any one of the categories mentioned in the first column of the Fourth Schedule to this Order shall be the amount specified opposite such category in the second column of the said Schedule.

6. This Order may be cited as the Housing on Farms (Grants) Order (Northern Ireland), 1958, and shall, subject to the provisions of sub-section (4) of section twelve of the Act, have effect from the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The object of this Order is to extend to the 1st January, 1960, the date before which plans for the provision of houses and the reconditioning of premises as houses on farms must be submitted to the Ministry of Health and Local Government for approval in order to qualify for grant.

The Order also prescribes the rates of grant payable in respect of new farmhouses, approved worker's houses, and reconditioning works, and prescribes the dates before which work must be completed in order to qualify for the rates of grant specified.

Contributions payable to persons in respect of houses built for letting

1. The contributions payable by a local authority in respect of housing accommodation provided for workers in accordance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of Section one of the Housing and Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1946, (in this Order referred to as "the Act of 1946") and the sums payable by the Ministry under sub-section (2) of Section one of the Act of 1946 to the local authority in respect of those contributions shall, in relation to each new house completed between the first day of January, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine and the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-nine inclusive, and falling within any one of the three categories mentioned in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order, consist respectively of a single payment of the amount specified opposite such category in the second and third columns of the said Schedule.
