#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order increases the maximum rate of grant applicable to expenditure incurred by Welfare Authorities in the provision of Welfare Homes from one half of the approved expenditure or £500 per bed whichever is the less to one half of the approved expenditure or £1,000 per bed whichever is the less.

#### Minimum Weekly Charges for Residential Accommodation

REGULATIONS, DATED 11TH APRIL, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNDER SECTION FIVE OF THE WELFARE SERVICES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1949.

The Ministry of Health and Local Government, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section five of the Welfare Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Welfare Authorities (Charges for Residential Accommodation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1958, and shall come into operation on the fourteenth day of April, 1958.

2. The minimum charge which a person shall be liable to pay for accommodation provided by or on behalf of a Welfare Authority, for the purposes of sub-section (3) of section five of the Welfare Services Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, shall be forty shillings per week.

3. Where accommodation is provided for a child accompanied by a person over the age of sixteen, the minimum charge which that person shall be liable to pay for the accommodation of that child shall be such one of the following sums as is appropriate:—

- (a) in respect of a child under five years of age, the sum of fourteen shillings and sixpence per week;
- (b) In respect of a child aged five years or over, but less than eleven years, the sum of seventeen shillings per week;
- (c) in respect of a child aged eleven years or over, but less than sixteen years, the sum of twenty shillings per week.

4. The Welfare Authorities (Charges for Residential Accommodation) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1955(a) are hereby revoked.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)*

The minimum weekly amount which a person is required to pay for accommodation (in a welfare home) provided by or on behalf of a Welfare Authority is increased from 32s. 6d. to 40s. In the case of a person accompanied by a child, the weekly amounts payable in respect of the child (which vary according to the child's age) are increased in each case to 14s. 6d., 17s. and 20s. respectively.
