ORDER DATED 15TH APRIL, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1877 TO 1934.

The Ministry of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in it under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts (Northern Ireland), 1877 to 1934, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf orders, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Short Title and Commencement

1.—(1) This Order shall be cited as the Potatoes (Frequency of Planting) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1958.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on 1st January, 1959.

Amendment of the Potatoes (Frequency of Planting) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1951(a)

2. The Potatoes (Frequency of Planting) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1951, shall be read and have effect as if the following were included in the Schedule thereto:—

“ District Number Five (Doagh-Ballyclare Area)

A district comprising:—

The townlands of (and all towns and villages included therein) Ballyclare (forming part of the Urban District of Ballyclare), Ballycor, Ballyeaston, Ballyhamage, Ballywee (E.D. Donegore), Ballywee (E.D. Kilbride), Coggrey, Cromy and Taggarts Land, Doagh, Durham’s Land, Ferguson’s Land, Fifty Acres, Freemanstown, Holestone, Kilbride, Moyadam, Rashee, all in the Barony of Antrim Upper, in the Administrative County of Antrim; Ballyclare and Ballygallagh (forming part of the Urban District of Ballyclare), Ballyhowne (E.D. Ballyclare Rural), Ballylinny, Bruslee, Clementshill, Grange of Ballywalter, all in the Barony of Belfast Lower, in the Administrative County of Antrim”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order amends the Potatoes (Frequency of Planting) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1951, by extending to the Doagh and Ballyclare districts of County Antrim the prohibition on the planting or growing of potatoes on the same land more often than twice in any period of eight years. The Order does not apply to gardens attached to dwellings in the area.

Whereas by Section One hundred and eighteen of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that Part II of the Act shall come into operation on such date after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council appoint for the commencement of that Part:

Now, therefore, I, John de Vere, Baron Wakehurst, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section one hundred and eighteen of the Act, do hereby order as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, (Commencement of Part II) Order (Northern Ireland), 1958.
