2. This Order may be cited as the Ulster Folk Museum (Appointed Day) Order, 1958.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

Under sub-section (2) of section 1 of the Ulster Folk Museum Act (Northern Ireland), 1958, the Trustees of the Ulster Folk Museum are to be established as a body corporate on such date as is appointed by Order made by the Minister of Finance. The purpose of this Order is to appoint 1st October, 1958, as that date.

The Ministry of Finance by virtue of powers conferred upon it by sub-section (1) of Section 15 of the Exchequer and Financial Provisions Act (Northern Ireland), 1950, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1. Article 8 of the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations, 1927(a), as substituted by Article 3 of the Ulster Savings Certificates (Ninth Issue) Regulations, 1956(b), shall be amended by substituting for the figure "600" in paragraph (e) of the said Article the figure "1,000".
- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1958.
- 3. These Regulations may be cited as the Ulster Savings Certificates (Ninth Issue) (Amendment) Regulations, 1958, and shall be construed as one with the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations, 1927(a), as subsequently amended and these Regulations and the Ulster Savings Certificate Regulations as so amended may together be cited as the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations, 1927 to 1958.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of these Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations amend the Ulster Savings Certificates (Ninth Issue) Regulations, 1956, which replaced Article 8 of the Ulster Savings Certificates Regulations, 1927. Their effect is to increase the maximum permitted holding of Ulster Savings Certificates of the Ninth Issue from 600 unit Certificates (£450) to 1,000 unit Certificates (£750) as from 1st May, 1958.

I, The Right Honourable W. W. B. Topping, Q.C., Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Special Constables Act, 1914, as extended and amended by Section Eight of the Constabulary Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and by sub-section (4) of Section Four of the Constabulary (Pensions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

PART I

AMENDMENTS TO THE ULSTER SPECIAL CONSTABULARY PENSIONS REGULATIONS, 1950, TO TAKE EFFECT FROM AND INCLUDING 1ST APRIL, 1956

- 1. In Regulation 13A the words "and paragraph (5) of Regulation 38 shall not apply to him" shall be omitted.
- 2. In Regulation 13B the words "and paragraph (4) of Regulation 38" shall be omitted.
- 3. For paragraph (2A) of Regulation 14 as set out in the 1956 Regulations there shall be substituted the following:—
 - "(2A) A widow's ordinary pension, including such a pension granted before the 1st April, 1956, shall be determined in accordance with Part I of the Second Schedule.
