

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order amends the Potatoes (Frequency of Planting) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1951, by extending to the Doagh and Ballyclare districts of County Antrim the prohibition on the planting or growing of potatoes on the same land more often than twice in any period of eight years. The Order does not apply to gardens attached to dwellings in the area.

Whereas by Section One hundred and eighteen of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that Part II of the Act shall come into operation on such date after the first day of April, one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council appoint for the commencement of that Part:

Now, therefore, I, John de Vere, Baron Wakehurst, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by section one hundred and eighteen of the Act, do hereby order as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, (Commencement of Part II) Order (Northern Ireland), 1958.

2. It is hereby declared that the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-eight shall be the date upon which Part II of the Act shall come into operation.

Educational Services Grants

REGULATIONS DATED 30TH JULY, 1958, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1947 TO 1956, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 104 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Educational Services (Queen's University Joint Committee for Adult Education) Grants Regulations, 1958.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st August, 1958.

2. For the purpose of these Regulations:—

"approved" means approved by the Ministry of Education;

"academic year" means the year beginning on 1st June and ending on 31st May;

"further education" has the meaning assigned to it by Section 39 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947.

3. Subject to the requirements of these Regulations the Ministry may make grants to the Queen's University Joint Committee for Adult Education in respect of approved expenditure incurred on or in connection with the provision of approved courses or classes of further education.

4. The amount of grant to be paid to the Committee in respect of each academic year shall be determined by the Ministry after consideration of the financial resources of the Committee as shown in duly certified and audited accounts, and the amount of grant payable to the Committee in respect of a year shall be a
