Wages Regulation (Wholesale Mantle and Costume)

ORDER, DATED 29TH DECEMBER, 1959, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945(a), TO GIVE EFFECT TO WAGES REGULATION PROPOSALS RECEIVED FROM THE WHOLESALE MANTLE AND COSTUME WAGES COUNCIL (NORTHERN IRELAND).

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1959.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Wages Council (Northern Ireland) Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order, 1958(b), shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 11th day of January, 1960, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

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LATE ENTRANTS

Paragraph 4.

Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 3, a male learner who commences employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 years may be employed for a period of twelve months as follows:—

- (a) for the first six months of employment, at a general minimum time rate of 2s. $4\frac{1}{2}d$. per hour;
- (b) for the second six months of employment, at a general minimum time rate of 2s. 6¹/₄d. per hour.

Provided that these general minimum time rates shall be increased by $1\frac{3}{4}d$. per hour in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over.

On the expiration of twelve months' employment in the trade, such worker is entitled to the minimum rate appropriate to a worker of his age.
