

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These Amendments to the Hatcheries Regulations will enable hatcheries to obtain eggs from sources (which must be approved by the Ministry) other than Accredited Farms, making possible the operation of a multiplying-farm system. They will also permit hatcheries to apply for authorisation to take in eggs for hatching after 1st June, subject to such conditions as may be from time to time imposed.

ROAD VEHICLES

REGULATIONS, DATED 4TH DAY OF JUNE, 1959, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929.

The Ministry of Home Affairs, in exercise of the powers vested in it by Section 8 of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1929, and of all powers thereunto enabling it, hereby makes the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Vehicles (Portrush, Co. Antrim) Regulations, 1959.

2. A person shall not, except by the express direction and permission of a member of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, drive or propel a vehicle of any kind whatsoever in the streets in the Urban District of Portrush in the County of Antrim specified in the Schedule to these Regulations except in the direction prescribed in relation to the streets in the Schedule.
