1938, relating to the withdrawal from a medical practitioner or dentist of authority, after reference of the matter to a tribunal, to possess and supply drugs are not reproduced; (b) new provision is made in Regulation 29 (1) enabling the authority of a person of unsound mind or undergoing mental treatment to possess and supply drugs to be withdrawn; (c) under Regulation 29 (2) the Ministry of Home Affairs is empowered to restore an authority which has been withdrawn, or suspend a withdrawal; (d) under Regulation 30 a person who is authorised to possess or supply drugs and has had his authority to do so in Great Britain withdrawn will cease to be an authorised person in Northern Ireland; and (e) under Regulation 34 the provisions of the Regulations regarding possession of drugs will not apply to possession by a carrier in the ordinary course of his business.

## Grammar Schools (Admissions, Scholarships and Special Allowances)

REGULATIONS, DATED 30TH MARCH, 1960, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF Education under the Education Acts (Northern Ireland), 1947 to 1958.

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 48 and 76 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Grammar Schools (Admissions, Scholarships and Special Allowances) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1960.

(2) The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Grammar Schools (Admissions, Scholarships and Special Allowances) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1953(a).

(3) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st April, 1960.

2. For the definitions of the terms "Incidentals Allowance" and "Maintenance Allowance" in Paragraph (1) of Regulation 2 of the existing Regulations there shall be substituted the following definitions : —

- "Incidentals Allowance" means a special allowance under the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) of Regulation 8 payable until the end of the day on which a qualified pupil attains the upper limit of the compulsory school age;
- "Maintenance Allowance" means a special allowance under the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (1) of Regulation 8 payable—
