EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations, which come into operation on the first day of May, 1961, amend the Measuring Instruments (Liquid Fuel and Lubricating Oil) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1931, under which (inter alia) an inspector who has withdrawn liquid fuel or lubricating oil from a tank or container for testing a measuring instrument is required to return it into that tank or container.

These Regulations enable the inspector to place the fuel or oil in another receptacle provided for that purpose by the trader or the person in charge of the instrument, if the inspector thinks it is impracticable and undesirable to return it to the original tank or container or the trader or the person in charge of the instrument does not wish him to do so.

We, the undersigned members of the Summary Jurisdiction Rules Committee appointed by the Minister of Home Affairs under sub-section (2) of section 1 of the Summary Jurisdiction Act (Northern Ireland), 1953, by virtue of the powers vested in us by section 2 of the said Act and of all other powers enabling us, do hereby make the Rule hereinafter set forth as a summary jurisdiction rule in regard to the fees on warrants, and, in pursuance of the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 3 of the said Summary Jurisdiction Act (Northern Ireland), 1953, do hereby certify the same under our hands and do submit it to the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland.
