Offences

6. Any person who fails to comply with the provisions of Article 4 of this Order or who wilfully obstructs or impedes an authorised officer in the exercise of the powers conferred on him by this Order shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds or, in respect of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

# Wages Regulation (Baking)

ORDER, DATED 23RD JUNE, 1961, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

# Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961.

#### Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

# Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 4th day of July, 1961, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.
