WAGES COUNCILS**Wages Regulation (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving)**

ORDER, DATED 4TH OCTOBER, 1961, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960(b), shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression “the specified date” means the 24th day of October, 1961, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression “the specified date” means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE**Statutory Minimum Remuneration**

The Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland), 1960(c) (Order N.I.F. (57)), as amended by the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960 (Order N.I.F. (59)), shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto for paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 the following paragraphs were substituted—

Paragraph 2.

Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph 1 the general minimum time rates for workers under 21 years of age are payable to such workers only if they are employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the general minimum time rate of 3s. 9½d. per hour. Otherwise the general minimum time rate will be 3s. 9½d. per hour, irrespective of age.

Paragraph 4.

Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph 3 the general minimum time rates for workers under 18 years of age are payable to such workers only if they are employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the general minimum time rate of 2s. 7d. per hour. Otherwise the general minimum time rate will be 2s. 7d. per hour, irrespective of age.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 24th October, 1961, amends the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland), 1960 (Order N.I.F. (57)), as amended by the Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960 (Order N.I.F. (59)), by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders. Order N.I.F. (59) is revoked.
