CLASSES OF WORKERS FOR WHOM NO STATUTORY MINIMUM REMUNERATION
HAS BEEN FIXED

Paragraph 25.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, the statutory minimum remuneration does not apply to workers employed as clerks, saleswomen, travellers, charwomen, time-keepers, or outside messengers.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 2nd February, 1961, sets out the statutory minimum remuneration payable in substitution for that fixed by the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland), 1960 (Order N.I.W.D. (93)), which Order is revoked.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.

WAGES COUNCILS

Wages Regulation (Aerated Waters)

ORDER, DATED 30TH JANUARY, 1961, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(b), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Aerated Waters Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Aerated Waters Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 7th day of February, 1961, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid

wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE:

Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The Aerated Waters Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland), 1960(a) (Order N.I.A. (56)), shall have effect as if in the First Schedule thereto for paragraphs 4 and 5 there were substituted the following paragraphs:—

"CALCULATION OF HOURLY RATES

Paragraph 4.

The general minimum time rates specified in paragraphs 1 to 3 are weekly rates based on 44 hours. For the purpose of calculating the general minimum time rate payable in respect of each hour of employment the respective weekly rates should be divided by 44.

OVERTIME

Paragraph 5.

Overtime rates are payable as follows:—

- (1) *On a Monday—for all time worked in excess of 8½ hours* *TIME-AND-A-HALF*
On a Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday—for all time worked in excess of 8¼ hours *TIME-AND-A-HALF*
Provided that where it is, or may become, the established custom of an employer to require the worker's attendance on five days only in the week the said overtime rate is payable—
On a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday—after 9 hours' work
On a Friday—after 8 hours' work
- (2) *On a Saturday—for all time worked in excess of 2½ hours* *TIME-AND-A-HALF*
Provided that where the worker is customarily required to attend on five days only in the week the said overtime rate is payable on a Saturday for all time worked.
- (3) *On a Sunday or a customary holiday—for all time worked* *DOUBLE TIME"*
