### POISONS

REGULATIONS, DATED 15TH DECEMBER, 1961, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION THIRTY-TWO OF THE MEDICINES, PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

I, the Right Honourable Brian Faulkner, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Section thirty-two of the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") and of all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. The purchase of an article by any person at the request of the Ministry of Home Affairs or of the Inspector appointed under Section eight of the Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland), 1925(b), for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of Part III of the Act and the Regulations made thereunder shall be deemed not to be a purchase within the meaning of paragraph (b) of sub-section (5) of Section twenty-nine of the Act.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Poison (No. 2) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1961, and shall remain in force for a period of five years from the 1st February, 1962, unless sooner revoked.
