EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations substantially re-enact in a consolidated and revised form the Public Health (Condensed Milk) Regulations, 1925, as subsequently amended. Certain new provisions have been introduced, the principal ones being—

- (a) to provide for the sale of condensed partly skimmed (half cream) milk labelled "should not be used for babies except under medical advice" (Paragraphs 1 (c) and (d) of the First Schedule);
- (b) to define half cream milk as meaning milk which contains not less than 10.8 per cent. of milk solids including not less than 1.8 per cent. of milk fat (Paragraph 2 of the First Schedule);
- (c) to prescribe minimum percentages of milk fat and milk solids including fat for condensed partly skimmed (half cream) milk (Second Schedule).

BEE PESTS AND DISEASES

Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1961

REGULATIONS, DATED 15TH FEBRUARY, 1961, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE BEE PEST PREVENTION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945, AS AMENDED BY THE BEE PEST PREVENTION (AMENDMENT) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1955.

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by the Bee Pest Prevention Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), as amended by the Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) Act (Northern Ireland), 1955(b), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following

Regulations by way of amendment of the Bee Pest Prevention Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950(a) (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Regulations").

Citation and commencement

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1961.

(2) These Regulations shall be read as one with the Principal Regulations and the Principal Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as the Bee Pest Prevention Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1950 and 1961.

(3) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 23rd day of February, nineteen hundred and sixty-one.

Revocation

2. The Bee Pest Prevention (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1960(b), are hereby revoked.

General

3. To paragraph (1) of Regulation 1 of the Principal Regulations there shall be added the following words:

"registered stocks" means the number of stocks for which fees have been paid in accordance with Regulation 10, reduced where appropriate by the number of any such stocks in respect of which compensation has already been paid.

Registration Fee

4. The fee payable under Regulation 10 of the Principal Regulations shall be one shilling and eightpence in respect of each stock.

Basis of Compensation

5. For paragraphs (3) and (4) of Regulation 11 of the Principal Regulations there shall be substituted the following new paragraphs:

"(3) Where, under the provisions of this Regulation, compensation in respect of the destruction of bees or appliances becomes payable to a registered bee-keeper and the number of stocks kept by him or under his control at the date of such destruction is greater than the number of registered stocks, the amount of any compensation for which he would otherwise be eligible shall be reduced in the proportion which the number of registered stocks bears to the total number of stocks kept by or under the control of the registered bee-keeper at the date of the destruction.

(4) For the purpose of this Regulation the value of bees and appliances shall be calculated as follows—

(a) Moveable-comb hive:
