EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order gives effect in Northern Ireland to provisions which have been arranged between the United Kingdom and Canada in the Letters set out in the Schedule to the Order, modifying the existing provisions contained in the Family Allowances and National Insurance (Canada) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960, for the reciprocal treatment of migrants in relation to old age insurance, and modifies the National Insurance Acts (Northern Ireland), 1946 to 1960, in their application to persons affected by those provisions.

ORDER DATED THE 31ST DAY OF JANUARY, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF FINANCE UNDER SECTION 14 OF THE MUSEUM ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1961.

I, the Right Honourable Terence Marne O'Neill, Minister of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by Section fourteen of the Museum Act (Northern Ireland), 1961(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The first day of April, 1962, shall be the appointed day for the purposes of the Museum Act (Northern Ireland), 1961.

2. This Order may be cited as the Ulster Museum (Appointed Day) Order (Northern Ireland), 1962.
