of the Family Allowances and National Insurance and Assistance Act (Northern Ireland), 1962, provide for the payment of a guardian's allowance in respect of a child in certain cases where one parent is dead and the surviving parent is in prison or in respect of whom an order has been made under section 56 or a direction has been issued under section 57 of the Mental Health Act (Northern Ireland), 1961. They also make provision for the repayment by the surviving parent to the National Insurance Fund of sums paid by virtue of the Regulations. The remaining provisions are of a minor or consequential character.

# **AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT LOANS**

## The Agricultural Development Loans (Rural and Agricultural Industries) (Hire Purchase) Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1962

SCHEME, DATED 25TH DAY OF JUNE, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER THE DEVELOPMENT LOANS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945(a).

The Ministry of Agriculture in accordance with the provisions of the Development Loans Act (Northern Ireland), 1945, hereby makes the following Scheme:—

#### Citation

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Agricultural Development Loans (Rural and Agricultural Industries) (Hire Purchase) Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1962.

### Purpose and conditions

2. The Ministry may grant to persons who operate or who intend to operate small rural or agricultural industries in Northern Ireland loans for the purchase of machinery and equipment for use in connection with the development of such industries upon such security and on such terms as may be determined by the Ministry.

#### General

3.—(1) The applicant shall deposit a minimum of 25% of the purchase price or such larger deposit as the Ministry may require.

(2) The amount of any loan shall not exceed two thousand pounds except with the special sanction of the Ministry of Finance.

(3) The applicant shall give such security as may be approved by the Ministry.

(4) Repayments shall be made in quarterly instalments or as may be approved by the Ministry.
