Wages Regulation (Baking)

ORDER, DATED 3RD AUGUST, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 1) Order (Northern Ireland), 1962.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 7) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961(b), shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 16th day of August, 1962, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

Paragraph 2.

The general minimum time rates applicable to male workers set out in Cols. 2 and 7 of the table in paragraph 1 will be increased by the appropriate additional amount specified hereafter which will not be taken into account for the purpose of the calculation of the statutory minimum remuneration due to such workers in respect of time worked in excess of the normal working day or of the normal working week—

In the case of journeymen bakers, doughmakers, ovensmen and			
confectionery mixers	by	10s.	0d. per week of 42 hours
In the case of jobbers	by	1s.	8d. for each week-day
In the case of apprentice bakers	by	4s.	0d. per week of 42 hours
In the case of bakehouse labourers,			
packers and all other male			
workers of 19 years of age and			
over	by	9s.	0d. per week of 42 hours
In the case of all other male			
workers under 19 years of age	by	5s.	0d. per week of 42 hours"
