### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on 16th August, 1962, amends the Baking Wages Regulation (No. 6) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961 (Order N.I.Bk. (273)), as amended by the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 7) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961 (Order N.I.Bk. (292)), by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders and by reducing the normal working week from one of 43 hours to one of 42 hours. Order N.I.Bk. (292) is revoked.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.

### WAGES COUNCILS

#### Wages Regulation (Baking)

ORDER, DATED 3RD AUGUST, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

#### *Citation*

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1962.

#### *Commencement*

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 8) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961(b), shall cease to have effect.

*Interpretation*

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 16th day of August, 1962, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

The Baking Wages Regulation (No. 1) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961(a) (Order N.I.Bk. (268)), as amended by the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 8) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961 (Order N.I.Bk. (293)), shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto—

1. the following paragraph were inserted in lieu of paragraph 1:—

"Paragraph 1.

Subject to the provisions of this Schedule the statutory minimum remuneration payable to workers of the classes specified in the following table is:—

"ADDITIONAL PAYMENTS FOR MALE WORKERS"

Paragraph 2.

The general minimum time rates applicable to male workers set out in Cols. 2 and 7 of the table in paragraph 1 will be increased by the appropriate additional amount specified hereafter which will not be taken into account for the purpose of the calculation of the statutory minimum remuneration due to such workers in respect of time worked in excess of the normal working day or of the normal working week—

- In the case of journeymen bakers, doughmakers, ovensmen and confectionery mixers .. .. by 9s. 9d. per week of 42 hours
- In the case of jobbers .. .. by 1s. 7½d. for each week-day
- In the case of apprentice bakers .. by 4s. 0d. per week of 42 hours
- In the case of bakehouse labourers, packers and all other male workers of 19 years of age and over .. .. by 8s. 9d. per week of 42 hours
- In the case of all other male workers under 19 years of age .. by 4s. 9d. per week of 42 hours."
