EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 16th August, 1962, amends the Baking Wages Regulation (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961 (Order N.I.Bk. (269)), as amended by the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 9) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961 (Order N.I.Bk. (294)), by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders and by reducing the normal working week from one of 43 hours to one of 42 hours. Order N.I.Bk. (294) is revoked.

WAGES COUNCILS

Wages Regulation (Baking)

ORDER, DATED 3RD AUGUST, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland), 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order (Northern Ireland), 1962.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 10) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961(b), shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 16th day of August, 1962, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond

with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

Subject to the provisions of paragraph 10 overtime rates are payable as follows:—

(1) (a) On *Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday* (not being customary holidays)—

For the first two hours worked in excess of 7½ hours	TIME-AND-A-QUARTER
Thereafter	TIME-AND-A-HALF

(b) On *Friday* (not being a customary holiday)—

For the first two hours worked in excess of 8 hours	TIME-AND-A-QUARTER
Thereafter	TIME-AND-A-HALF

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require the worker's attendance on only five days in the week, the said overtime rates of time-and-a-quarter and time-and-a-half are payable on each of the days *Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday* after 8½ and 10½ hours' work respectively, and on *Tuesday* after 8 and 10 hours' work respectively.

(2) On *Saturday* (not being a customary holiday)—

For the first two hours worked in excess of 4 hours	TIME-AND-A-QUARTER
Thereafter	TIME-AND-A-HALF

(3) On *Sunday* or on a customary holiday—

For all time worked	DOUBLE TIME

Paragraph 10.

Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 9, overtime rates may be paid to *Drivers, Helpers and Lorry Boys* as follows—

(1) On days other than *Sundays* or customary holidays—

(a) For the first two hours worked in excess of 7½ hours on each of five days in the week	TIME-AND-A-QUARTER
Thereafter	TIME-AND-A-HALF

(b) For the first two hours worked in excess of 4½ hours on the remaining day of the week	TIME-AND-A-QUARTER
Thereafter	TIME-AND-A-HALF

(2) On *Sunday* or on a customary holiday—

For all time worked	DOUBLE TIME"
