

in Parts II and V of the First Schedule of the South Approach Road Order, 1961(a), shall be transferred to the Ministry of Finance as from the day of transfer; and, accordingly, as from that day by virtue of this Order and without any further conveyance, transfer or assignment—

- (a) the said property, real or personal, hereby transferred shall vest in the Ministry of Finance;
- (b) the said rights shall be enjoyed by that Ministry; and
- (c) the said liabilities shall become liabilities of that Ministry.

Modification and adaptation of Enactments

5. There shall be made in every local and personal Act and public general Act of a local character such modifications and adaptations as may be required to bring it into conformity with the provisions of this Order.

ROAD TRAFFIC

Speed Limits

ORDER*, DATED 11TH JANUARY, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SUB-SECTION (4) OF SECTION TWENTY-THREE OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1955.

The Ministry of Home Affairs in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sub-section (4) of section twenty-three of the Road Traffic Act (Northern Ireland), 1955(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby orders and directs as follows:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Roads (Speed Limit) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1962, and shall come into operation on 1st April, 1962.

Restriction of Road

2. The length of road specified in the First Schedule shall be a restricted road for the purposes of section twenty-three of the Act.

Increase of Speed Limit on Certain Roads

3. As respects the lengths of road specified in the Second Schedule, the rate of speed fixed by sub-section (1) of section twenty-three of the Act shall be increased to forty miles an hour.

FIRST SCHEDULE

The Belfast-Bangor Road, Trunk Road No. T.1, County Down, from a point approximately 250 yards west of the junction with the Clondeboye to Six Road Ends Road (Route C.368), known as the Rathgael Road, to a point approximately 1,620 yards north-east of this junction.

SECOND SCHEDULE

1. The Lisburn-Moira Road, Trunk Road No. T.3, Lisburn, County Antrim, from a point 100 yards west of the junction with the Lisburn-Ballinderry Road, Class II, No. B.104, to the junction with the Lower Lissue Road, Class III, No. C.6.

2. The Lisburn-Lurgan Road, Trunk Road No. T.3, at Dollingstown, County Down, from the Lurgan Borough Boundary to the junction with Taughrane Road.

3. The Belfast-Bangor Road, Trunk Road No. T.1, County Down, from a point approximately 250 yards west of the junction with the Clondeboye to Six Road Ends Road, (Route C.368), known as the Rathgael Road, to a point approximately 1,620 yards north-east of this junction.

4. The Belfast-Bangor Road, Trunk Road No. T.1, Bangor, County Down, from a point approximately 210 yards west of the junction with Silverstream Road, Bangor, to a point approximately 535 yards west of this junction.

5. The Knock-Newtownbreda Road, Class I, No. A.504, County Down, from a point approximately 180 yards north-east of the junction with Cregagh Park to a point approximately 1,480 yards north-east of this junction.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order applies the 40 m.p.h. speed limit to certain roads in Counties Antrim and Down.
