

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations prescribe the form of notice to be given to interested persons after a vesting order has become operative. This form was introduced following the amendment made to the 1934 Act by Section 20 of the Public Health and Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland), 1962.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT

Eradication of Bovine Tuberculosis

ORDER, DATED 27TH MARCH, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTIONS 3, 13 AND 18 OF THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1958(a).

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections three, thirteen and eighteen of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland), 1958, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Tuberculosis (Movement of Cattle) (No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland), 1962, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1962.

Interpretation

2. In this Order:—

“Act” means the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland), 1958;

“animal” means bovine animal;

“attested animal” means an animal moved under the conditions of a permit from a herd accepted as attested in a certificate issued in accordance with the requirements of the Tuberculosis (Attested Herds) (Northern Ireland) Scheme, 1959(b), or of the Attested Herds Scheme of the Government of the Republic of Ireland or from any herd of equivalent status;

“Ministry” means Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland;

“point of entry” has the meaning assigned to it in the Imported Livestock Order, 1958(c).

Importation of Animals from the Republic of Ireland

3. No animal other than an attested animal, accompanied by a valid movement permit or licence showing it to be an attested animal and signed by a person authorised for that purpose by the Department of Agriculture of the Republic of Ireland, shall be imported into Northern Ireland from the Republic of Ireland.

Point of Entry

4.—(1) Animals shall not enter Northern Ireland from the Republic of Ireland at any place other than at a point of entry shown in the Schedule.

(2) The points of entry designated in the Schedule shall not be used except on the dates and at the times specified therein. These dates and times may be altered by the Ministry by a display of notices indicating such alterations at any particular point of entry.

Restriction on Shipment

5. An animal shall not be shipped to Great Britain unless it is an attested animal and is:—

- (a) accompanied by a valid movement permit or licence issued by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland or the Department of Agriculture of the Republic of Ireland showing it to be an attested animal; and
- (b) suitably marked for identification purposes in such a manner as the Ministry may from time to time direct.

Amendment

6. The Tuberculosis (Identification of Animals) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960(a), shall be amended as follows:—

For paragraph (2) of Article 3 of that Order the following paragraph shall be substituted—

“(2) For the purposes of this Article where an animal imported from the Republic of Ireland is being moved onto such premises in Northern Ireland under the provisions of Article 3 of the Tuberculosis (Movement of Cattle) (No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland), 1962, an ear tag or ear tattoo applied to its ear in the Republic of Ireland under the Attested Herds Scheme or the Bovine Tuberculosis (Eradication) Scheme of the Republic of Ireland, or any substituted enactment for the time being in force shall be accepted as a mark, but the Ministry may require such an animal to be re-marked by the herdowner onto whose premises it is moved.”

Revocation

7. The Tuberculosis (Movement of Cattle) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland), 1960(b), the Tuberculosis (Movement of Cattle) (No. 2) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961(c), and the Tuberculosis (Entry of Attested Animals) Order (Northern Ireland), 1961(d), are revoked from the commencement of this Order without prejudice to anything duly done thereunder.
