

“(5) In order to prevent the spread of disease the owner of a hatchery shall when required to do so by notice from the Ministry in writing—

(a) discontinue wholly or in part the distribution of chicks;

(b) remove from incubators all or any eggs;

(c) discontinue any particular settings;

such notice to remain in force until withdrawn.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

This Amendment alters certain conditions attaching to a hatchery licence. These conditions relate to disease and to the weight of eggs for hatching. These alterations were necessary to make the Regulations conform with the proposed Accredited Poultry Farms Scheme for 1962-63.

Accredited Poultry Farms Scheme

SCHEME, DATED 9TH APRIL, 1962, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE AGRICULTURE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1949(a), AND UNDER SECTION 2 OF THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1958(b).

The Ministry of Agriculture by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sub-section (1) of section nine of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland), 1949, and by sub-sections (1) and (3) of section two of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland), 1958, and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Scheme:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Accredited Poultry Farms (Amendment) Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1962, and shall come into operation on the 10th day of April, 1962.
