

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the rules but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The purpose of these rules is to preserve continuity of superannuation rights of persons who transfer between teaching service in Scotland and the Civil Service in Northern Ireland.

The rules provide—

- (a) that if a person in employment in the teaching service in Scotland transfers within a prescribed period to an established post in the Civil Service and a transfer value is paid to the Ministry of Finance the period of employment in teaching service in respect of which the transfer value is paid may be reckoned for civil service superannuation; and
- (b) that if a civil servant transfers within a prescribed period to employment in the teaching service in Scotland a transfer value may be paid by the Ministry to the teaching service authority.

In the case mentioned at (b), provision is being made by the teaching service authority for the period of employment in the Civil Service to be reckoned as teaching service.

Under express powers in sections 5 and 6 of the parent Act the rules have a limited retrospective effect, but the retrospective provisions will apply only at the election of the person concerned and with the consent of the authority which becomes liable to pay a transfer value.
