Headage Payments—Cattle

SCHEME; DATED 10TH MAY, 1963, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 1(1) OF THE AGRICULTURE (TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1954(a) AS AMENDED BY THE AGRICULTURE (TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE) (AMENDMENT) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1957(b).

The Minister of Agriculture with the approval of the Minister of Finance and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Agricultural (Temporary Assistance) Acts (Northern Ireland) 1954 and 1957 and of all other powers him thereunto enabling, hereby makes the following Scheme:—

Short title and commencement

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Cattle Headage Payments Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1963.

(2) This Scheme shall have effect from the 1st April, 1963.

Definitions

2. In this Scheme—

“Fatstock Guarantee Scheme” means the Fatstock Guarantee Scheme 1963/64 in operation in Great Britain and in Northern Ireland.

“Home-Bred” means born and entirely produced in Northern Ireland.

“Cattle” means fat cattle or the carcasses of such animals.

“Certified” means certified under the Fatstock Guarantee Scheme.

Headage payments

3. The Ministry may, subject to and in accordance with the succeeding provisions of this Scheme, make to persons producing home-bred cattle a payment at the rate of three pounds in respect of each home-bred animal which is properly certified under the Fatstock Guarantee Scheme at any Liveweight or Deadweight Certification Centre in Northern Ireland.

4. In case of doubt as to the proper certification of an animal, or as to the proper person to be paid, eligibility for the headage payment shall be at the discretion of the Ministry.

5.—(1) Where a butcher or meat wholesaler has certified, by deadweight, home-bred cattle which were not produced by him the payment shall be made to the farmer who sold the cattle to the said butcher or meat wholesaler.

(2) Payment in all other cases of both liveweight and deadweight certification shall be made to the person in whose name the home-bred cattle were certified.

6. There shall be no contract or obligation on the part of the Ministry to make any headage payment and all headage payments shall be at the Ministry's absolute discretion.

7. If the Ministry, after having made a payment under this Scheme finds that such payment ought not to have been made in whole or in part or that the payment was in excess of the amount properly payable it may recover from the person to whom such payment has been made the whole or any part of the sum already paid, or may withhold or cause to be withheld any subsequent payment which would otherwise be or become due to that person under this or any other Scheme under which payment becomes due by the Ministry. The Ministry may also recover from a person producing home-bred cattle by way of deduction from a payment which might otherwise be made to him under this Scheme any monies due by that person to the Ministry or to any other Government Department.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order enables the Ministry of Agriculture to pay to farmers Headage Payments in respect of home-bred cattle certified under the Fatstock Guarantee Scheme 1963/64.

FOYLE FISHERIES

Foyle Area (Rivers Faughan and Roe Angling) Regulations 1963

REGULATIONS, DATED 30TH APRIL 1963, MADE BY THE FOYLE FISHERIES COMMISSION WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER FOR LANDS OF THE IRISH REPUBLIC UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT 1952 AND OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1952.

The Foyle Fisheries Commission in exercise of its powers under Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 and Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 hereby makes the following regulations:

1. These regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area (Rivers Faughan and Roe Angling) Regulations 1963.

2. These regulations shall apply to the rivers Faughan and Roe and their tributaries and shall come into effect on the 13th of May 1963.
