7. If the Ministry, after having made a payment under this Scheme finds that such payment ought not to have been made in whole or in part or that the payment was in excess of the amount properly payable it may recover from the person to whom such payment has been made the whole or any part of the sum already paid, or may withhold or cause to be withheld any subsequent payment which would otherwise be or become due to that person under this or any other Scheme under which payment becomes due by the Ministry. The Ministry may also recover from a person producing home-bred cattle by way of deduction from a payment which might otherwise be made to him under this Scheme any monies due by that person to the Ministry or to any other Government Department.

Foyle Area (Rivers Faughan and Roe Angling) Regulations 1963

REGULATIONS, DATED 30TH APRIL 1963, MADE BY THE FOYLE FISHERIES COMMISSION WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER FOR LANDS OF THE IRISH REPUBLIC UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT 1952 AND OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1952.

The Foyle Fisheries Commission in exercise of its powers under Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 and Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 hereby makes the following regulations:

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area (Rivers Faughan and Roe Angling) Regulations 1963.
- 2. These regulations shall apply to the rivers Faughan and Roe and their tributaries and shall come into effect on the 13th of May 1963.

- 3. For the purpose of these regulations:
- (a) the term "night fishing" shall mean angling on any day later than one hour after sunset or earlier than one hour before sunrise.
- (b) the gape of a hook shall be measured as the distance when the hook is normally aligned between the point of the hook and the shank of the hook.
- 4. Angling shall be by any of the methods named in the first column of the schedule hereto and shall be subject to the respective limitations and restrictions specified in the third column of the said schedule. No person shall angle by any other method or in contravention of the said limitations and restrictions.
 - 5. Fishing by any method is prohibited within fifty yards downstream of:
 - (a) the weir known as Kane's Rock on the River Roe in the townland of Deer Park, County Londonderry.
 - (b) the weir known as Given's on the River Roe in the townland of Terrydremont, County Londonderry.
- 6. It is prohibited to snatch or to attempt to snatch or foul hook salmon with any kind of hook or combination of hooks covered in part or in whole with any matter or thing or uncovered and whether used with a rod and line or otherwise.
- 7. The Foyle Area (Rivers Faughan and Roe Angling) Regulations 1959(a) are hereby revoked.

(e) The bait shall not be suspended in the water by float or similar device.
THREADLINING	Angling with rod, fixed spool reel, threadline and single lure constructed to have a spinning or other motion when worked in the water.	 (a) Night fishing shall be prohibited. (b) The lure shall have not more than one treble hook or alternatively one single hook. (c) The gape of each hook shall not exceed 6 mm. (d) The breaking strain of the line used shall not exceed 8 lbs. (e) The maximum length of the rod shall not exceed 9 feet.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations and does not purport to be a legal interpretation.)

These Regulations amend the Foyle Area (Rivers Faughan and Roe Angling) Regulations 1959 by permitting fly fishing at night time until July 15th each season, and by prohibiting the use of floats in bait fishing. Fishing fifty yards downstream of Given's Weir in the townland of Terrydremont is also prohibited.

The Foyle Fisheries Commission hereinafter referred to as "the Commission" in exercise of its powers under Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 and Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 hereby makes the following regulations:

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area (Prevention of Pollution) Regulations 1963.
- 2. These regulations shall apply to all discharges of effluent from sand or gravel washing plants within the Foyle Area and shall come into effect on 13th May 1963.
- 3. Subject to these regulations no person shall without the consent of the Commission discharge on or after 1st July 1963 any effluent from a sand or gravel washing plant into a river in the Foyle Area.
- 4. An application to the Commission for its consent under these regulations shall state:
 - (a) The maximum quantity of the effluent which it is proposed to discharge during any one day.
 - (b) The highest rate at which it is proposed to discharge the effluent.
 - (c) The exact location of the proposed plant and outfall of the effluent.
 - (d) The proposed method of disposal or treatment of the effluent.
- 5. On application for consent under Article 4 of these regulations the Commission may grant its consent subject to such conditions as it may impose, which conditions may include conditions as to:
