

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations revise and consolidate the various regulations dealing with compulsory acquisition of land by local authorities made under Section 22 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1934.

EDUCATION

Teachers' Salaries

REGULATIONS, DATED 30TH JULY, 1963, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1947 TO 1962.

The Ministry of Education, in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland) 1947(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Teachers' Salaries Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1963 No. 2.

(2) These Regulations other than Regulation 4 shall come into operation on 1st August, 1963. Regulation 4 shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April, 1963.

2. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Teachers' Salaries Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1961(b).

3. For Regulation 15 of the existing Regulations shall be substituted:—

“15.—(1) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations there may be paid in a school allowances (hereinafter referred to as “graded allowances”) in respect of such number of posts and of such maximum aggregate value as are indicated in Schedule VI or Schedule VII (as the case may be) as appropriate to the points score of the school and the type of school.

The teachers to whom such allowances may be paid shall, without prejudice to the power of the employing authority to pay such allowances to other teachers in special circumstances, include heads of departments and teachers undertaking special responsibility or special work of an advanced character.

(2) The value of each grade of graded allowance shall be as follows:—

(3) Subject to the provisions of these Regulations and to the approval of the Ministry, the employing authority shall determine the grade of each such allowance, the duties to be attached to each post carrying such an allowance and the teacher to be appointed thereto.

(4) The maximum graded allowance payable to a teacher shall not exceed—

- (a) in a primary or special school £180
- (b) in an intermediate school £385
- (c) in any school—the allowance payable to the vice-principal of the school.

(5) A teacher shall not receive more than one graded allowance at any time, or receive a graded allowance at any time when he is entitled to an allowance under Regulations 11 to 14.

(6) (a) If in any special school on 31st December, 1961,

- (i) the number of allowances paid in respect of posts of special responsibility other than the post of vice-principal (hereinafter referred to as "responsibility allowances") exceeds the number of graded posts appropriate to the school in accordance with these Regulations; or
- (ii) the aggregate value of such responsibility allowances exceeds the maximum aggregate value of graded allowances appropriate to the school in accordance with these Regulations

a teacher who on the said 31st December held a responsibility allowance in the school shall continue to be entitled thereto so long as with the approval of the employing authority and of the Ministry he carries out the duties allocated to the post of special responsibility.

(b) In any school in which any responsibility allowance continues to be payable under sub-paragraph (a), no graded allowance shall be awarded to any teacher nor shall any responsibility allowance or graded allowance be increased if the effect of such award or increase would be that

- (i) the aggregate of the number of responsibility allowances and graded allowances in the school exceeded the number of graded allowances authorised by these Regulations; or
- (ii) the aggregate value of the said responsibility allowances and graded allowances in the school exceeded the maximum aggregate value of the graded allowances authorised by these Regulations.

(7) Where in the opinion of the Ministry advanced work or other work of special value is done in any intermediate school the maximum aggregate value of graded allowances appropriate to the school under Schedule VI may be increased by an approved sum and, if the Ministry so approves, the maximum number of graded posts in the school may be increased."

4. In Regulation 17, paragraphs (1) and (3), of the existing Regulations for references to the sum of £70 shall be substituted references to the sum of £80.

5. In paragraph 3(e) of Schedule III to the existing Regulations, for the words—

"Credit in full if the schools are recognised by the Department of Education for the Republic"

shall be substituted—

"To such extent as the Ministry may determine after such enquiry as it thinks fit".

6. The Schedules set out in the Appendix to these Regulations shall be substituted for the Schedules in the existing Regulations which bear the same respective numbers.

7. Regulation 5 of the Teachers' Salaries Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1963(a) is revoked.

In a special school with a points score exceeding 299 but not exceeding 360 a Grade I allowance may be allocated by the employing authority with the approval of the Ministry. In a special school with a points score exceeding 360 a Grade I allowance additional to those for which the foregoing table provides may be allocated by the employing authority with the approval of the Ministry.

These Regulations introduce from 1st August, 1963, revised allowances in respect of graded posts in grant-aided schools and amend the allowances payable to teachers of special schools and special classes.

ANIMALS

Milk Recording and Progeny Testing

SCHEME, DATED 25TH JULY, 1963, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE AGRICULTURE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1949.

The Ministry of Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section Nine of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland) 1949(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Scheme:—

Citation and Commencement

1. This Scheme may be cited as the Milk Recording and Progeny Testing Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1963 and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, nineteen hundred and sixty-three.
