

SECOND SCHEDULE

Holidays and Holiday Remuneration

The Brush and Broom Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order (Northern Ireland) 1962(a) (Order N.I.B.B. (87)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto—

1. the proviso to sub-paragraph (1)(a) of paragraph 6 were omitted.
2. in paragraph 11, for the definition of "TOTAL REMUNERATION" there were substituted the following:—

"TOTAL REMUNERATION" means any payments paid or payable to the worker under his contract of employment for time (other than hours of overtime) worked or piece work done by him (other than during hours of overtime), holiday remuneration, any productivity or long service bonus payable to the worker on a weekly, fortnightly or monthly basis and merit payments so payable, but does not include any other payments."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order comes into operation on 29th March, 1963. The First Schedule sets out the statutory minimum remuneration payable in substitution for that fixed by the Brush and Broom Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 (Order N.I.B.B. (86)). The Second Schedule contains two amendments to the method of calculating holiday remuneration fixed by the Brush and Broom Wages Regulation (Holidays) Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 (Order N.I.B.B. (87)).

New provisions in the Schedules are printed in italics.

AGRICULTURAL MARKETING

Milk

ORDER, DATED 25TH DAY OF MARCH, 1963, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 1(4) OF THE AGRICULTURAL MARKETING ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1933(b).

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, after such consultation

as is required and in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (4) of Section 1 of the Agricultural Marketing Act (Northern Ireland) 1933, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Milk Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment No. 8) Order 1963, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1963.

Amendments

2. The Milk Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1955, as approved by the Milk Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Approval) Order 1955(a), shall be amended as follows:—

For Part XIV thereof the following Part shall be substituted:—

“PART XIV

Quality Premiums

41.—(1) The Board may pay to each registered producer who holds a Farm Bottling licence under the Milk Acts (Northern Ireland) 1950(b) and 1963(c), a premium of such amount on such conditions and in such manner as the Board may from time to time determine in respect of Farm Bottled milk produced and sold by him in bottles or cartons.

(2) The Board may pay to each registered producer to whom the Ministry has granted a Certificate of Superior Hygienic Quality in accordance with the Milk Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1963(d), a premium of such amount on such conditions and in such manner as the Board may from time to time determine in respect of milk produced and sold by him.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order amends the Milk Marketing Scheme of 1955 by substituting the name “Farm Bottling Licence” for “Grade ‘A’ (T.T.) Licence”. This change is consequential to the Milk (Amendment) Act (Northern Ireland) 1963.

It also authorises the Milk Marketing Board to pay Quality Premiums to the holders of Certificates of Superior Hygienic Quality under the Milk Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1963.
