Allocation of Pension

Rules, dated 10th September, 1964, made by the Ministry of Finance under Sections 12 and 13 of the Resident Magistrates' Pensions Act (Northern Ireland) 1960.

The Ministry of Finance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 12 and 13 of the Resident Magistrates' Pensions Act (Northern Ireland) 1960(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following rules:—

Citation and Commencement

1. These rules may be cited as the Resident Magistrates (Allocation of Pension) (Amendment) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1964, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1964.

Amendment of the Resident Magistrates (Allocation of Pension) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1962

2. The Resident Magistrates (Allocation of Pension) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1962(b) shall be amended by:—

- (a) deleting rule 7(1)(c) thereof; and
- (b) substituting references to the sum of £6 6s. 0d. for the references to the sum of £3 3s. 0d. in rule 12(8) thereof.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the rules but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

The Resident Magistrates (Allocation of Pension) Rules (Northern Ireland) 1962, under which a retiring Resident Magistrate may allocate part of his pension in favour of his wife or other beneficiary and a retired Resident Magistrate under the age of 70 who has married subsequent to retirement, may allocate part of his pension in favour of his wife, contained a restriction as to the minimum amount that could be allocated. The amending rules now made remove that restriction.

The amending rules also provide that the maximum fee payable in respect of an examination by a Medical Board shall be increased from £3 3s. 0d. to £6 6s. 0d.
