Poultry Test

SCHEME, DATED 18TH DECEMBER, 1964, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 9 OF THE AGRICULTURE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1949.

The Ministry of Agriculture (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section Nine of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland) 1949(a), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Citation and commencement

- 1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Poultry Testing (Amendment) Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1964.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Poultry Testing Scheme (Northern Ireland) 1962(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Scheme") and this Scheme and the Principal Scheme may be cited together as the Poultry Testing Schemes (Northern Ireland) 1962 and 1964.
- (3) This Scheme shall come into operation on 31st day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty-five.

Amendment of the Principal Scheme

- 2.—(1) Paragraph (4) of Article 5 shall be deleted.
- (2) At the end of sub-paragraph (k) of Paragraph (5) of Article 8 there shall be added the words "If tested such entry shall not be eligible for any award".
- (3) In Article 9 for the word "shall" there shall be substituted the word "may".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of the Scheme but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Scheme amends the Principal Scheme as follows:-

- (1) The requirement that entries for the tests shall be accepted only from flocks in Northern Ireland is removed.
- (2) Where, notwithstanding the fact that the number of pullets in an entry falls below the number required by the conditions governing the test, the Ministry decides not to exclude the entry, that entry shall not be eligible for any award.
- (3) The Ministry is no longer required to include a control sample in the test of commercial birds, but it may do so if this is considered necessary.

Commencement (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1964

Order, dated 17th December, 1964, made by the Minister of Labour and National Insurance under the National Insurance &c. Act (Northern Ireland) 1964.

Whereas it is provided by paragraph 1 of Schedule 7 to the National Insurance &c. Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 that the provisions of that Act(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1964") shall come into force on such day or days as the Minister of Labour and National Insurance may by order appoint:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable William James Morgan, Minister of Labour and National Insurance, hereby make the following Order:

- 1.—(1) Subject to the provisions of Articles 2 and 3, the day appointed for the coming into force of any provision of the Act of 1964 specified in column 1 of the Schedule, so far as that provision relates to any subject matter specified in column 2 of that Schedule, shall be the date specified in column 3 of that Schedule in relation to that subject matter.
- (2) Accordingly, for the purposes of section 5 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1963(b), as applied with amendments by paragraph 9 of Schedule 7 to the Act of 1964 (transitory provision as respects assistance grants), the date by which all the increases of benefit under the Act of 1964 have taken effect shall be the 31st March, 1965.
