Educational Conferences

REGULATIONS, DATED 27TH FEBRUARY, 1964, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1947.

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by sections 79 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland) 1947, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as The Educational Conferences (Local Education Authorities) Regulations 1964.

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings assigned to them, that is to say:—

"authority" means local education authority;

"conference" means conference or meeting held for the purpose of discussing any matter connected with the discharge of the functions of local education authorities but does not include any conference or meeting organised primarily with a view to the advancement of the interest of any particular profession, class of officer or trade union;

"education association" means an association of local education authorities or other bodies the functions of which involve the regular discussion of questions relating to education.

3. An authority may incur reasonable expenditure:—

- (a) for the purpose of paying or contributing towards yearly subscriptions to education associations;
- (b) in organising or participating in the organisation of conferences;
- (c) on purchasing reports of the proceedings of any conference;
- (d) on the payment of travelling and subsistence expenses of any member or officer authorised by them to attend a conference:

Provided that not more than three members and three officers shall be authorised to attend a conference held in Northern Ireland, not more than one member and one officer shall be authorised to attend a conference held elsewhere in the British Isles and no officer or member shall be authorised to attend a conference outside the British Isles unless the prior approval of the Ministry to such authorisation is obtained.

4. The payments which an authority may make under Regulation 3(d) of these regulations towards expenditure on travelling or subsistence incurred by any member or officer authorised by them to attend a conference shall not exceed:—

- (a) in the case of members of the authority the rates prescribed in the Local Government (Allowances to Members) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1955(a);

- (b) in the case of officers the approved rates applicable to officers of the authority.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations prescribe the conditions in which a local education authority may incur reasonable expenditure in connection with educational conferences or meetings.

SUPREME COURT, NORTHERN IRELAND PROCEDURE

The Election Petition Rules 1964

We, the Northern Ireland Supreme Court Rules Committee, being the authority for the time being having power under section 7 of the Northern Ireland Act 1962(a) to make rules for the purposes of Part II and Part III of the Representation of the People Act 1949(b), hereby exercise those powers and all other powers enabling us in that behalf as follows:—

Citation, Commencement and Application

1.—(1) These rules may be cited as the Election Petition Rules 1964, and shall come into force on the 6th day of April, 1964.

(2) These rules shall apply to proceedings questioning an election or return or complaining of no return to the Parliament of the United Kingdom.

(3) Nothing in these rules shall affect any petition presented before these rules came into force.

Interpretation

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act 1889(c) shall apply to the interpretation of these rules as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

“the Act” means the Representation of the People Act 1949;

“Attorney General” means the Attorney General for Northern Ireland;
