

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These rules make provision for election petitions questioning an election or return or complaining of no return to the Parliament of the United Kingdom under the Representation of the People Act 1949. The rules replace, in modern form, the existing rules which were made in 1868.

The practice and procedure of the High Court, subject to the provisions of the above Act and these rules, have been applied to a petition as if it were an ordinary action within the jurisdiction of the High Court.

FOYLE FISHERIES

**Foyle Area (Close Season for Angling)
Regulations 1964**

REGULATIONS, DATED 12TH FEBRUARY, 1964, MADE BY THE FOYLE FISHERIES COMMISSION WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER FOR LANDS OF THE IRISH REPUBLIC UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT 1952 AND OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE FOR NORTHERN IRELAND UNDER SECTION 13 OF THE FOYLE FISHERIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1952.

The Foyle Fisheries Commission in exercise of its powers under Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act 1952 and Section 13 of the Foyle Fisheries Act (Northern Ireland) 1952 hereby makes the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Foyle Area (Close Season for Angling) Regulations 1964, and shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1964.

2. It is hereby prescribed that the annual close season for angling in the River Mourne its lakes and tributaries shall be from the eleventh day in October in any year to the thirty-first day in March in the year following both days inclusive.

3. The Foyle Area (Close Season for Angling) Regulations 1962(a) are hereby revoked.

4. These regulations if not earlier revoked shall remain in force until the thirty-first day of March, 1967, and shall then cease to have effect.
