Wages Regulation (Baking)

Order, dated 25th May, 1964, made by the Ministry of Labour and National Insurance under the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Baking Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Baking Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 1) Order (Northern Ireland) 1964.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 9th day of June, 1964, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE

Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The Baking Wages Regulation (No. 3) Order (Northern Ireland) 1963(b) (Order N.I.Bk. (320)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto for paragraph 1 there were substituted the following paragraph—

"Paragraph 1.

Subject to the provisions of this Schedule the statutory minimum remuneration payable to workers of the classes specified in the following table is:—
