**WAGES COUNCILS****Wages Regulation (Paper Box)**

ORDER, DATED 25TH MAY, 1964, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR AND NATIONAL INSURANCE UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945.

The Ministry of Labour and National Insurance, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the Paper Box Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

*Citation*

1. This Order may be cited as the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1964.

*Commencement*

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1962(b) shall cease to have effect.

*Interpretation*

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 5th day of June, 1964, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

## SCHEDULE

## Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The Paper Box Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1961(a) (Order N.I.B. (71)), as amended by the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 (Order N.I.B. (73)), shall have effect as if in the First Schedule thereto—

- 1.—for paragraphs 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 there were substituted the following paragraphs:—

Provided that any such worker employed on carton forme making or in charge of an automatic carton glueing machine or a carton cutting and creasing machine fitted with fully automatic feeder shall be entitled to an additional amount of 8s. 6d. per week of 42 hours.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on 5th June, 1964, sets out the statutory minimum remuneration payable in substitution for that fixed by the First Schedule to the Paper Box Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1961 (Order N.I.B. (71)), as amended by the Paper Box Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1962 (Order N.I.B. (73)).

Order N.I.B. (73) is revoked.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
