**SUPREME COURT, NORTHERN IRELAND
PROCEDURE**

The Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (No. 2) 1965

We, the Northern Ireland Supreme Court Rules Committee, being the authority having for the time being power under section 7 of the Northern Ireland Act 1962(a) to make, amend or revoke rules regulating the practice and procedure of the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, hereby exercise those powers and all other powers enabling us in that behalf as follows:—

1. For rule 56 of Order LXXIX of the Rules of the Supreme Court 1936(b), which relates to proceedings in the Registries, Queen's Bench Division (Probate), there shall be substituted the following rule:—

“56.—(1) Part 1 of Order XXXVIII, which relates to affidavits, shall apply to affidavits filed or used in a Registry.

(2) In its application to affidavits so filed or used, rule 9 of Order XXXVIII shall apply as if the words “or other description” were inserted after the word “occupation”.”

2. These rules may be cited as the Rules of the Supreme Court (Northern Ireland) (No. 2) 1965, and shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1965.
