

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)*

These Regulations specify the conditions that have to be satisfied before persons can be deemed to be trained in first-aid for the purposes of Regulation 6 of the Docks Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1934; and, in the case of certain docks, wharves or quays, require particulars relating to persons so trained to be entered in or attached to the general register.

## FACTORIES

## Washing Facilities (Miscellaneous Industries)

REGULATIONS, DATED 9TH DECEMBER, 1965, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1938.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services in exercise of powers conferred by sections 47 and 65 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1938(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act"), and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following special Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Washing Facilities (Miscellaneous Industries) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965, and shall come into operation on the 13th day of December, 1965.

2. None of the requirements as to washing facilities imposed by any of the provisions in the order and regulations specified in the Schedule to these Regulations shall be in substitution for, or in diminution of, the provision in Section 18 of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1959(b), that the washing facilities for the use of employed persons required by section 43(1) of the principal Act, shall include a supply of hot and cold or of warm water.

3. These Regulations shall be without prejudice to any regulations under subsection (3) of the said section 43.
