Smoke Control Areas—Exempted Fireplaces

REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH APRIL, 1965, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTION 11 OF THE CLEAN AIR ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1964.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 11 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation and Commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Smoke Control Areas (Exempted Fireplaces) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1965.

Exempted Fireplaces

2. The classes of fireplace described in the first column of the Schedule shall, subject to the conditions set out in the second column opposite the description of the fireplace, be exempted from the provisions of section 11 of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964.

(1) Class of fireplace	(2) Conditions
Fireplaces, specially designed or adapted for the combustion of liquid fuel.	The fireplace shall be so installed, maintained and operated as to minimise the emission of smoke.
Fireplaces, other than fireplaces fired by pulverised fuel, constructed on or after the 1st day of July, 1965 and equipped with mechanical stokers, or adapted on or after that date for use with such stokers.	The fireplace shall be so installed, maintained and operated as to minimise the emission of smoke. No fuel shall be used other than that for which the mechanical stoker was designed.
The fireplace known as the Solid Fuel Ductair Unit, manufactured by Radiation Limited.	The fireplace shall be so installed, maintained and operated as to minimise the emission of smoke, and in any case in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
The fireplace known as the Fulgora Slow Combustion Stove, manufactured by Fulgora Stoves Limited.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

Section 11(7) of the Clean Air Act (Northern Ireland) 1964 empowers the Ministry of Health and Social Services to exempt any class of fireplace, (as defined in the Act) upon such conditions as it may prescribe, from the provisions of the section (which relates to smoke control areas) if it is satisfied that such fireplaces can be used for burning fuel other than authorised fuels without producing any smoke or a substantial quantity of smoke. These regulations exempt the classes of fireplaces set out in the first column of the Schedule thereto on the conditions set out opposite the class in the second column.

REGULATIONS, DATED 15TH APRIL, 1965, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (INDUSTRIAL INJURIES) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1946.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, in exercise of powers conferred by section 25(1) of the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) Act (Northern Ireland) 1946(a), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) (Claims and Payments) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965, shall be read as one with the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) (Claims and Payments) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1948(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"), and shall come into operation on 19th April, 1965.
