

for animals intended for immediate export so that they can be rested, fed and inspected there as required by any Order under the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1958.

Bye-laws

4. The Corporation is hereby empowered to make bye-laws for the regulation and control of the lairage and for prescribing charges or tolls approved by the Ministry after consultation with the Ministry of Finance for the use of the said lairage and in default of such bye-laws such charges or tolls shall be prescribed by an Order of the Ministry made after consultation with the Ministry of Finance.

Application of Enactments

5.—(1) Sections 37 and 38 of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1958 shall apply to the Corporation in like manner as they apply to a Health Authority.

(2) Sections 219 to 223 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878(a) and Section 27 of the Local Government Act (Northern Ireland) 1934(b) shall apply to bye-laws made by the Corporation pursuant to this Order in like manner as they apply to bye-laws made by a Sanitary Authority as if for references therein to the Local Government Board and the Ministry of Home Affairs respectively there were substituted references to the Ministry.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order empowers the Belfast Corporation to construct pens for the temporary detention for the purposes of resting, feeding and inspecting of animals prior to their shipment from Belfast Port and to make bye-laws.

Commencement Order (Northern Ireland) 1966

ORDER, DATED 19TH MAY, 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (SUPPLEMENTATION) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

Whereas it is provided by section 13(2) of the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) that the provisions of that Act shall come into force with effect from such date or dates (whether before or after the passing of that Act) as the Minister of Health and Social Services may by order appoint:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable William James Morgan, Minister of Health and Social Services, hereby make the following Order:

1. The provisions of section 2 of the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Act (Northern Ireland) 1966 shall come into force with effect from the 1st March, 1966 and the other provisions of that Act shall come into force with effect from the 23rd May, 1966.

2. This Order may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Commencement Order (Northern Ireland) 1966.

REGULATIONS, DATED 19TH MAY, 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES, WITH THE CONSENT OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE, UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (SUPPLEMENTATION) ACT, (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of powers conferred by the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

PART I

GENERAL

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966

(2) (a) These regulations shall come into force with effect from the 1st March, 1966 being the date appointed for the coming into operation of section 2 of the Act so far as it is necessary to give effect to that section.
