AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE**Bacon Curers' Licences and Returns**

REGULATIONS, DATED 3RD FEBRUARY, 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTION 20 OF THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (MEAT REGULATION AND PIG INDUSTRY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1962, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 19 OF THE AGRICULTURE (MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1965.

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 20 of the Agricultural Produce (Meat Regulation and Pig Industry) Act (Northern Ireland) 1962(a), as amended by Section 19 of the Agriculture (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act (Northern Ireland) 1965(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following regulations:—

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Bacon Curers' (Licences and Returns) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966.

Curing Licences

2.—(1) Application for a curing licence shall be made in the form prescribed in the First Schedule.

(2) A curing licence shall be in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule.

(3) Application for renewal of a curing licence shall be made in writing to the Ministry by the licence holder at least fourteen days before the date of expiry of the licence or the last renewal thereof and shall be accompanied by the statutory fee of ten pounds. The certificate of renewal of a licence shall be in the form prescribed in the Third Schedule.

Records and returns

3.—(1) Every licensed bacon curer shall, in respect of each week, complete and furnish to the Ministry returns in accordance with:—

(a) the Fourth Schedule in relation to his purchases and sales of pigs; and

(b) the Fifth Schedule in relation to his production and sales of pig products;

and shall keep such records as will permit of the particulars required for the completion of the said returns being readily available for inspection by an authorised officer of the Ministry.

(2) Such returns shall be made to the Ministry not later than the Tuesday following the week to which they relate.

The returns to be made by a licensed bacon curer to the Ministry in connection with his purchases and sales of pigs and his production and sales of pig products are also prescribed.

WAGES COUNCILS

Wages Regulation (General Waste Materials Reclamation)

ORDER, DATED 7TH FEBRUARY, 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1966.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1965(b) shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression “the specified date” means the 15th day of February, 1966, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression “the specified date” means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.
