WAGES COUNCILS**Wages Regulation (General Waste Materials Reclamation)**

ORDER, DATED 14TH DECEMBER 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER THE WAGES COUNCILS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 10 of the Wages Councils Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a), hereby makes the following Order to give effect to wages regulation proposals received from the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Council (Northern Ireland):—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 1966.

Commencement

2. The wages regulation proposals set out in the Schedule shall come into operation on the specified date and on the day immediately preceding that date the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1966(b) shall cease to have effect.

Interpretation

3. In this Order the expression "the specified date" means the 2nd day of January 1967, provided that where, as respects any worker who is paid wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, that date does not correspond with the beginning of the period for which the wages are paid, the expression "the specified date" means, as respects that worker, the beginning of the next such period following that date.

SCHEDULE

Statutory Minimum Remuneration

The General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1964(a) (Order N.I.W.R. (69)) as amended by the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1966 (Order N.I.W.R. (73)) shall have effect as if in the Schedule thereto—

1.—for paragraphs 1 and 2 there were substituted the following paragraphs—

(A) Workers engaged on operations in connection with scrap rubber, scrap iron or other scrap metal, used tins, or broken glass or earthenware and who are aged—						Per hour	Per week of 40 hours

(C) Workers of 21 years of age and over employed as—

- (a) power crane drivers will, for all time during which they are so employed, be entitled to 3d. per hour in addition to the statutory minimum remuneration otherwise payable.
- (b) burner cutters will, for all time during which they are so employed, be entitled to 2½d. per hour in addition to the statutory minimum remuneration otherwise payable.
- (c) drivers of lorries with the carrying capacities set out below will, for all time during which they are so employed, be entitled to the appropriate amount set out hereunder in addition to the statutory minimum remuneration otherwise payable—

Carrying Capacity	Additional Amount per hour
under 2 tons ..	2d.
2 tons and under 8 tons ..	4d.
8 tons and over ..	6d.

“Carrying Capacity” means—

- (i) the weight of the load which the vehicle has been designed or constructed to carry and/or haul according to the pay load rating as specified or declared by the manufacturers of the vehicle,
- (ii) where a trailer is attached to a vehicle the carrying capacity of that vehicle shall be the carrying capacity of the vehicle and trailer combined.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 2nd January 1967, amends the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation Order (Northern Ireland) 1964 (Order N.I.W.R. (69)) as amended by the General Waste Materials Reclamation Wages Regulation (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 1966 (Order N.I.W.R. (73)), by increasing the statutory minimum remuneration fixed by those Orders.

Order N.I.W.R. (73) is revoked.

New provisions in the Schedule are printed in italics.
