Secondary Schools: Grant Conditions

REGULATIONS, DATED 22ND MARCH, 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1947 TO 1963, WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE.

The Ministry of Education (hereinafter called "the Ministry") in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 104 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland) 1947(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf and with the approval of the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Secondary Schools (Grant Conditions) Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st April, 1966.

2. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Secondary Schools (Grant Conditions) Regulations 1965(b).

3. The following paragraph is hereby substituted for paragraph 1 of the First Schedule to the existing Regulations:—

"Salary Grant

1. Salary grant shall be payable in respect of each recognised teacher appointed to the authorised staff of a voluntary grammar school by the school authorities with the approval of the Ministry and shall be an annual rate equal to two-thirds of the amount by which the annual rate of salary (including the vice-principal's allowance, graded allowance or allowance for second master or second mistress) payable to the teacher under the Regulations exceeds the rate of £567 per annum:

Provided that in respect of any period of absence, owing to illness, in respect of which a teacher is paid half salary, the salary grant payable by the Ministry in respect of him for the period shall be half the salary grant that would normally be payable."

Reciprocal Agreement with the Republic of Ireland

Order in Council, dated 21st March, 1966, made under section 61 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1946.

BY THE GOVERNOR IN THE PRIVY COUNCIL OF NORTHERN IRELAND

ERSKINE OF RERRICK

Whereas at Dublin on 28th February, 1966, an Agreement on social security between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Ireland (which Agreement is set out in the Schedule and is hereinafter referred to as "the Agreement") was signed on behalf of those Governments:

And whereas by Article 5 of the Agreement it is provided that the Agreement shall come into force on 4th April, 1966:

And whereas by section 61 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1946(a), it is provided that the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council make provision for modifying or adapting that Act in its application to cases affected by agreements with other governments providing for reciprocity in matters specified in that section:

Now, therefore, I, John Maxwell, Baron Erskine of Rerrick, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor of Northern Ireland, in pursuance of the said section 61 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1946, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, do hereby order as follows:—

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the National Insurance (Republic of Ireland) Order (Northern Ireland) 1966.

Modification of Acts

2. The provisions contained in the Agreement shall have full force and effect, so far as the same relate to Northern Ireland and provide for reciprocity with the Government of the Republic of Ireland in any matters specified in section 61(1) of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1946; and
