EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations amend the National Insurance (Industrial Injuries) (Benefit) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1948 so as to give effect in Northern Ireland to those recommendations of the Committee on the Assessment of Disablement (Cmnd. 2847) relating to the scheduled degrees of disablement and the provision of a new rate of constant attendance allowance where the need for such attendance is greater because of exceptionally severe disablement.

POISONS

REGULATIONS, DATED 6TH APRIL, 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 32 OF THE MEDICINES. PHARMACY AND POISONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1945.

I, the Right Honourable Robert William Brian McConnell, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers vested in me by Section 32 of the Medicines, Pharmacy and Poisons Act (Northern Ireland) 1945(a) on the recommendation of the Poisons Board do hereby make the following Regulations:—

Citation and Commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Poisons Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966 and shall come into operation on 1st May, 1966.

2. For Paragraph (2) of Regulation 33 of the Poisons Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965(b) there shall be substituted the following paragraph, that is to say:

"(2) In all establishments in which poisons for the treatment of human ailments are sold by way of wholesale dealing and wherein the breaking of bulk, or repacking and relabelling of the poisons takes place, the department in which the poisons are stored must be in the charge of a person holding any of the qualifications set out in the foregoing paragraph (1) and this person must supervise the labelling of all poisons sold or supplied."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations modify the Poisons Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965 to enable establishments dealing in the sale by way of wholesale of poisons for the treatment of human ailments and where no breaking of bulk, or repacking and relabelling of the poisons takes place to dispense with the requirement of having a person qualified as provided in Regulation 33(1) in charge of the department in which the poisons are stored.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922-1943

REGULATIONS, DATED 14TH APRIL, 1966, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF HOME AFFAIRS UNDER SECTION 1(3) OF THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1922.

Whereas by virtue of the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland) 1922(a) there are in force certain Regulations for peace and order in Northern Ireland being—

(a) Regulations contained in the Schedule to that Act, and

(b) Regulations made by the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland pursuant to powers conferred by section 1(3) of the said Act

(which Regulations where contained in the Schedule or made as aforesaid are hereinafter referred to as the "principal Regulations"):

And whereas the said Minister is empowered by the said section 1(3) to make Regulations for making further provision for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order and any Regulations so made shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, have effect and be in force in like manner as Regulations contained in the Schedule to that Act:

And whereas it is expedient that further provision for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order should be made:

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Robert William Brian McConnell, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the said section 1(3), do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. At the end of Regulation 5A of the principal Regulations there shall be inserted the following Regulation: —

"5B.—(1) The Civil Authority, if in any circumstances he considers it necessary so to do for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order, may by Order prohibit or restrict, during such period or periods as may be specified, any traffic on railways in Northern Ireland.
