

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order prescribes—

- (a) the register to be kept, and the particulars to be sent to the Chief Inspector, in pursuance of Section 90(1) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965 in respect of the overtime employment of any woman or young person; and
- (b) the particulars to be contained in the notice required by Section 90(2) of the said Act to be kept posted in the factory in respect of such overtime employment and the time during which the said notice is to be kept posted.

The register and the particulars prescribed by this Order are in substitution for those prescribed by as much of the Factories (Forms and Particulars) Order (Northern Ireland) dated 30th June 1939 as deals with Forms N.I.21 and N.I.22 which are revoked.

**The Use of Lead Paint in Connection with Buildings Register Order
(Northern Ireland) 1967**

ORDER, DATED 6TH JUNE 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTION 127 OF THE FACTORIES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1965.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland in exercise of powers conferred by Section 127(4) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965(a) and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Use of Lead Paint in Connection with Buildings Register Order (Northern Ireland) 1967 and shall come into operation on the 6th day of June 1967.

2. The register required by Section 127(4) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965 to be kept at the office of every person who employs persons in painting buildings shall be in the form set out in the Schedule and shall contain the particulars therein specified.

INSTRUCTIONS

- General** 1. Every person who employs persons in painting buildings is required under Section 127(4) of the Factories Act (Northern Ireland) 1965, to keep at his office a register containing the prescribed particulars as to the persons so employed by him and as to the work on which they are employed.
- Persons employed** 2. The employer or his agent must enter in Part I the particulars of every person employed by him in painting buildings.
- Contracts or Jobs** 3. The employer or his agent must enter in Part II, and *keep up to date*, the list of contracts or jobs on which persons are employed by him in painting buildings, unless such information is readily available for inspection by an Inspector of Factories through the ordinary business books of the employer, in which case the list required in Part II need not be kept.
- Lead Poisoning** 4. Notice of every case of lead poisoning occurring to persons employed in painting buildings must be sent to the Chief Inspector of Factories and particulars must be entered in the General Register (form N.I.36).

Note.—Any person failing to comply with the above-mentioned requirements is liable on summary conviction to a penalty.

ULSTER TRANSPORT AUTHORITY

Automatic Barriers at Level Crossings

ORDER*, DATED 18TH MAY 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF DEVELOPMENT UNDER SECTION 40 OF THE TRANSPORT ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

The Ministry of Development in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by section 40 of the Transport Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ulster Transport Authority (Maze and Damhead Level Crossings) Order 1967.

2. In this Order:—

“The Authority” means the Ulster Transport Authority; “nearside” means the left-hand side of the road or carriageway in relation to a person approaching the level crossing along the road or carriageway and “offside” means the right-hand side of the road or carriageway in relation to any such person.

3. So long as this Order continues in force section 47 of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act 1845(b) and section 6 of the Railways Clauses Act 1863(c) shall cease to apply to the level crossings referred to in the First Schedule being level crossings at which public carriage roads are crossed on the level by a railway of the Authority.

4. The following provisions shall apply with respect to the said level crossings—

(1) The Authority shall provide at the level crossings and shall maintain and operate so long as this Order continues in force, the barriers, lights and other devices specified in the Second Schedule.

(2) The Authority shall secure at the level crossings the maintenance and operation by the appropriate road authority of the traffic signs specified in the Second Schedule.
