

4. 40 lb. Wooden Box.

(a) The fruit shall be protected from direct contact with the wood by a layer of corrugated cardboard. Plain or coloured packing paper may be used as desired.

(b) Lids of fibreboard or wood shall be firmly secured.

5. 40 and 30 lb. Fibreboard Boxes.

(a) Packing pads may be used under and/or over the apples as required.

(b) The boxes shall be firmly secured by means of wire straps, staples, adhesive or adhesive tape.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations prescribe—

- (1) the standards required for the grading of fresh apples and pears;
- (2) the type of labels to be used;
- (3) the type of packages to be used when consigning apples and pears out of Northern Ireland;
- (4) the fee for the issue or renewal of a licence required under the Regulations.

NATIONAL INSURANCE

Mariners

REGULATIONS, DATED 22ND JUNE 1967, MADE BY THE NATIONAL INSURANCE JOINT AUTHORITY UNDER THE NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

The National Insurance Joint Authority, in exercise of powers conferred by section 19 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following regulations:

Citation

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the National Insurance (Mariners) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967, shall be read as one with the National Insurance (Mariners) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967(b) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations"),

Mariners attending training courses or courses of instruction

2.—(1) As from 13th April 1968 (being the date of the coming into effect of the provisions of the National Insurance (Mariners) Amendment Regulations 1967(c) corresponding to this regulation), a mariner shall no

longer be deemed to be available for employment in an employed contributor's employment on any day by virtue of his attending on that day at a training course or course of instruction, nor shall a day on which he so attends be treated as a day of unemployment by virtue of his attendance.

(2) Accordingly, the provisions of regulation 14(1)(b) of the principal regulations shall be revoked as from that date.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to
indicate their general purport.)*

These regulations amend the National Insurance (Mariners) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967 so that the provisions of those regulations which provide that mariners attending training courses or courses of instruction shall be deemed to be available for employment and that days of such attendance shall be treated as days of unemployment shall cease to have effect from 13th April 1968.

First-aid

ORDER, DATED 27TH JUNE 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES UNDER SECTIONS 24(2) AND (6) AND 75(2) OF THE OFFICE AND SHOP PREMISES ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1966.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services in exercise of the powers conferred on it by sections 24(2) and (6) and 75(2) of the Office and Shop Premises Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Office and Shop Premises (First-aid) Order (Northern Ireland) 1967 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1968 with the exception of Article 4 which shall come into operation on 1st January 1969.
