DISEASES OF ANIMALS

Importation of Dung

ORDER, DATED 30TH JUNE 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE UNDER SECTIONS 23 AND 53 OF THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1958.

The Ministry of Agriculture in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 23 and 53 of the Diseases of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 1958(a) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and Commencement

1. This Order which may be cited as the Importation of Dung Order (Northern Ireland) 1967 shall come into operation on 30th June 1967.

Interpretation

2. In this Order

“Animal” means cattle, goats, horses, sheep, all other ruminating animals and swine.

“Dung” means the excrement of animals and poultry whether in its natural state or dried or otherwise processed for the purpose of rendering it suitable for use as a fertiliser or a feeding stuff but does not include dung associated with the import of animals or poultry.

“Poultry” means domestic fowls.

Restriction on Importation

3. The landing of dung is hereby prohibited except in accordance with the conditions of a licence granted by the Ministry.

Licences

4.—(1) The Ministry shall issue a licence in accordance with this Order only when it is satisfied that any conditions attaching to the issue of the licence for the purpose of minimising the risk of introducing disease have been or will be complied with.

(2) A licence issued under this Order may be issued in respect of one or more landings and may be revoked at any time by notice in writing delivered or posted to the licensee.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Order empowers the Ministry to control the importation in any form of dung of certain animals and birds for the purpose of reducing the risk of introducing disease of animals or poultry.

Teachers' Salaries and Allowances

REGULATIONS, DATED 10TH JULY 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION UNDER THE EDUCATION ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1947 TO 1966.

The Ministry of Education, hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry", in pursuance of the powers vested in it by Sections 83 and 112 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland) 1947(a) and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, and after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Teachers' Salaries Amending Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on 1st August 1967.

2. The existing Regulations hereby amended are the Teachers' Salaries Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1965(b).

3. For the words "in other exceptional circumstances" in Regulation 13(4) of the existing Regulations there shall be substituted the words "in such other circumstances as the Ministry may deem proper".

4. For Regulation 13A of the existing Regulations there shall be substituted:—

"13A.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of Regulation 13(1) and (2), the points score for each school for each of the school years 1967/68, 1968/69, and 1969/70 shall unless the Ministry otherwise determines be the average of the points scores determined in 1965, 1966 and 1967: provided that where this average is in a lower group than the average of the points scores determined in 1965 and 1966 the school shall be deemed to be in the next higher group.

(2) In reckoning averages for the purpose of this Regulation fractions of one-half or more than one-half shall be counted as units, and fractions of less than one-half shall not be counted."
