Supplementation

REGULATIONS, DATED 20TH OCTOBER 1967, MADE BY THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES. WITH THE CONSENT OF THE MINISTRY OF FINANCE. WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (SUPPLEMENTATION) ACTS UNDER THE (Northern Ireland) 1966 and 1967.

The Ministry of Health and Social Services, with the consent of the Ministry of Finance, in exercise of powers conferred by section 2 of the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Act (Northern Ireland) 1966(a) as amended by section 3 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1967(b), and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Amendment Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1967, shall be read as one with the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966(c) (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations") and shall come into operation on 31st October 1967.

Amendment of regulation 7 of the principal regulations

2. In regulation 7(1) of the principal regulations (computation of loss of earnings) for the words "the date of the coming into force of section 2 of the Act" there shall be substituted the words "31st October 1967".

Amendment of regulation 10 of the principal regulations

3. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations (allowances in respect of two or more different injuries or diseases) shall be amended by substituting in paragraph (a)(iii) for the sum "47s. 6d." the sum "55s.".

Amendment of Schedule 1 to the principal regulations

4. Schedule 1 to the principal regulations shall be amended by substituting for the sum "125s. 0d." in the first column thereof the sum "139s. 11d." and by the addition at the end of the first and second columns thereof respectively of the sum "140s. 0d." and "55s. 0d.".

Transitional provision

5. Where a lesser incapacity allowance has been awarded to a person under the principal regulations before 31st October 1967 and a question arises as to the weekly rate of that allowance payable in consequence of these regulations, the case shall be reviewed by the Ministry in the light of the amendments made by these regulations and the allowance shall continue to be payable at the weekly rate specified in the award until the question shall have been determined in accordance with the provisions of the principal regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These regulations amend the Workmen's Compensation (Supplementation) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1966 so as to give effect to section 3 of the National Insurance Act (Northern Ireland) 1967 by increasing the weekly rate of lesser incapacity allowance payable in certain circumstances.
